

# Levels of learning

### **Prep Year**

At Bhaktivedanta School, we want our students' first experiences of education to be enjoyable and engaging. By the end of the Prep Year, we aim for all our children to have developed positive attitudes to school. They will develop relationships with adults and peers whilst engaged in meaningful learning tasks set in a calm environment.

The Bhaktivedanta School will offer the children in the Prep Year with a balanced Curriculum. This allows plenty of opportunities to learn through play and creativity in a wide variety of contexts with a focus on;

- . personal, social and emotional development
- . communication, language and literacy
- . problem-solving, reasoning and numeracy
- . knowledge and understanding of the world
- . physical and creative development

Our teachers will encourage all children to ask questions and talk about their self-expression, connectedness, communication and active learning style. Work will be differentiated, and additional support will be provided to those in need.

### Grades 1 to 6

Throughout Grades 1 - 6, students will continue to develop a love of reading, through an effective balance of synthetic phonics, drama, speaking and listening tasks, guided reading and storytelling. We know that children who can communicate orally and in writing, and who understand the value and pleasure of reading, are more likely to have happy, fulfilling, academic and personal lives. With these skills, children will access a broad and balanced curriculum as suitable for each year level, that will be integrated using an inquiry approach which includes;

- Literacy

- · ICT (Information and Communications Technology)


